Calgary Sport and Social Club Full Weather Policy

Daily Weather Call

- O The daily weather call is posted online immediately after a final decision has been reached. Updates are posted no later than:
 - 4:30 p.m. Weekday Leagues
 - 11:30 a.m. Sunday Leagues
- O Please do not call the office regarding the weather call if the website is not yet updated, a decision has not yet been made
- O Due to the short season, and limited number of rain-out make-up weeks available, the CSSC will attempt to play games when possible
- O Due to the nature of Alberta weather and outdoor sports, players should expect that some games may be played in less than ideal conditions (rain, lower temperatures, etc)
- The CSSC will look to cancel games on days where the weather is extremely poor and/or player safety could be compromised
- The weather in Alberta can change quickly and can vary drastically in different areas of the City at any given time, players are never forced to compromise their safety!
 - Even if games are posted 'ON,' players should use their best judgement when at the field if the conditions have deteriorated

Factors of the Daily Weather Call

- O During the Outdoor Season the CSSC monitors the weather hourly and makes a daily weather call based on a variety of factors:
 - Hourly forecast and temperature
 - Projected rainfall / precipitation
 - Radar maps and data
 - Environment Canada and other weather alerts
 - Field conditions as reported by the CSSC field staff



Regular Season Rain-Out Scenarios

- O Both teams are required to arrive at the field/court on time with the minimum number of players required to avoid a default
- O If conditions are unplayable, including a stoppage due to thunder & lightning, teams are expected to wait **20 minutes** for the possibility of the weather to pass, before calling the game off
- O In the instance teams have waited 20 minutes, the following 3 options are possible:
 - O If both teams choose to cancel their game, results will be recorded as follows:
 - If at least half the game was played at the time it was called, the score will stand
 - If less than half the game was played, the score will be entered as a tie
 - If both teams would like to try to re-schedule, a 0-0 tie should be submitted, along with a re-schedule form
 - The CSSC will help facilitate a re-schedule, but the game must be played at least one week prior to playoffs
 - The CSSC will not issue refunds to teams in place of a re-schedule
 - The City of Calgary <u>does not</u> refund user groups for field rental costs in the case of inclement weather
 - If one team chooses not to play, but the other team believes the conditions are appropriate for outdoor play, the result will be recorded as follows:
 - The team that does not want to play will receive a default loss in the standings
 - No default fee will be charged, and no default refund will be awarded to the team being defaulted against
 - Spirit Rating / Sportsmanship points will be awarded in full
 - The CSSC will not issue refunds to teams in place of a re-schedule

O For outdoor sports that have an on-site Coordinator

- The coordinator will have the final say on the conditions
- If the Coordinator decides conditions are playable but if one or more teams choose not to play:
 - The team(s) that do not want to play will receive a default loss in the standings
 - No default fee will be charged, and no default refund will be awarded to the team(s) being defaulted against
 - Spirit Rating / Sportsmanship points will be awarded in full
 - The CSSC will not issue refunds to teams



If games are 'OFF' or fields are 'closed' during the regular season:

O 8-week Leagues:

- 1st time the season will be extended by one week; the game will be re-scheduled
- 2nd time CSSC will evaluate the schedule and attempt to re-schedule by:
 - Running a double-header week (single-opponent sports)
 - Running multiple three-match weeks (double-opponent sports)
- 3rd time or more the game will not be re-scheduled and refunds will not be issued
 - Unfortunately, the City of Calgary does not refund user groups for field rental costs and in the case of inclement weather, the CSSC is paying to rebook fields

O 16-week Leagues:

- 1st and 2nd time the season will be extended by one week for each cancellation;
 the game(s) will be re-scheduled
- 3rd time CSSC will evaluate the schedule and attempt to re-schedule by:
 - o Running a double-header week (single-opponent sports)
 - Running multiple three-match weeks (double-opponent sports)
- 4th time or more the game will not be re-scheduled and refunds will not be issued
 - Unfortunately, the City of Calgary <u>does not</u> refund user groups for field rental costs and in the case of inclement weather, the CSSC is paying to rebook fields

O 5-week Fall Leagues:

- 1st time the season will be extended by one week; the game will be re-scheduled
- 2nd time CSSC will evaluate the schedule and attempt to re-schedule a game by:
 - Running a double-header week (single-opponent sports)
 - Running multiple three-match weeks (double-opponent sports)
- 3rd time the CSSC will evaluate the schedule and attempt to re-schedule by:
 - Running a double-header week (single-opponent sports)
 - Running multiple three-match weeks (double-opponent sports)



^{*} The City of Calgary can close the outdoor fields for the year at any time during the Fall Season due to continuous inclement weather – in these cases, the CSSC will explore options to finish the season, and will issue pro-rated refunds to teams for any remaining games that cannot be played

Playoff Rain-Out Scenarios

If games are 'ON':

O See above policies under 'Regular Season Rain-out' Scenarios

If games are 'OFF' or fields are 'closed' during the playoffs

- O 1st time the games will be re-scheduled to the following week and the season extended
- O 2nd time (or more):
 - If there have been no rain-outs during the regular season for that league, the playoffs will again be re-scheduled to the following week and the season extended
 - If there has been rain-out(s) during the regular season for that league the CSSC will evaluate the schedule and attempt to re-schedule by:
 - Working with the individual teams to find a date / time that works (priority will be given to teams competing in the championship)
 - Moving the games indoors (if possible)
 - Refunds will not be issued whether the CSSC can re-schedule or not
 - Unfortunately, the City of Calgary <u>does not</u> refund user groups for field rental costs and in the case of inclement weather, the CSSC is paying to rebook fields

Rain-Out Reschedules

- O If games were called 'OFF' by the CSSC, resulting in a re-schedule, the Club will update the online schedules as soon as possible the re-scheduled games will frequently be added at the end of the regular-season, meaning the rest of the schedule usually remains untouched
- O If games were called 'ON' by the CSSC, but teams were unable to play the game
 - Enter a 0-0 tie along with comments when submitting the score online
 - Fill out the re-schedule form and the CSSC will facilitate the next steps



Extreme Weather Conditions

Thunder and Lightning

- If you hear thunder (or see lightning), captains should make a decision to pause / delay the game and move off of the playfield to a safe location (vehicles)
- Players need to wait 20-minutes to allow the thunder / lightning a chance to pass before calling the game off
- If conditions become playable again within 20-minutes, the game should be resumed and played within the original booking time
 - o If at least half the game was played, the score will stand
 - o If less than half the game was played, the score will be entered as a tie

Air Quality

- The Club will call games 'OFF' anytime that the <u>Air Quality Health Index</u> is an above **10** rating at the time the weather call / update is due to be made
- At this level the Government of Canada encourages the **general population** to "reduce or re-schedule strenuous activities outdoors"
- The CSSC understands that some players are more at-risk than others due to poor air quality, and encourages any player in the at-risk population to find a sub on days where the index is at a 7 or above

O High Temperatures

- The Club does not call games off due to heat waves and high temperatures.
- The CSSC encourages teams to discuss with their opponents if they would like to make modifications to the game format (e.g. more breaks, subs, etc.)
- The CSSC understands that some players are more at-risk than others due to extreme heat, and encourages players to find a sub on days they may be uncomfortable playing

O One-off extreme weather conditions (e.g. flooding)

- Will be handled on a case by case basis
- The Club will monitor the situation, making the best decision possible and communicating to the teams in a timely manner
